



Health Policies

These requirements and suggestions are not a guarantee against infection, but an attempt to minimize the chances of contagion. Every Dog takes the safety of all dogs in our care extremely seriously and we appreciate your compliance and understanding with our requirements.

Every Dog Procedures

If a dog exhibits *any* signs or symptoms of a respiratory infection, they will immediately be put in a comfortable, isolated area until their owner can retrieve them. Dogs in the isolation ward will be cared for with fluids, potty breaks, and (when appropriate) chew toys, but will not be allowed to have any contact with other dogs. Owners (or an authorized person) will be required to pick up their dogs as soon as possible.

Dogs will be allowed back into the facility only after they have been cleared by a vet of any possible contagious infection. If owners are unable to care for their dogs during any recovery/quarantine period, arrangements must be made with Every Dog for isolated convalescent care. We will not be able to provide any transportation, spa or other services to dogs needing isolated convalescent care.

If your dog is excused from daycare for quarantine purposes, you will receive a credit on your monthly membership fee upon their return from quarantine. If Every Dog is required to give isolated convalescent care during the quarantine time, no credit will be issued and normal convalescent fees apply.

*Please do **NOT** bring your dog to daycare if they have green and/or bloody mucus from the nose or if they have a recurring cough of any kind - especially if it sounds like they "have something caught in their throat". If your dog is exhibiting any of these symptoms, you should contact your vet.*

General Precautions

These precautions can help prevent exposure and potential infection.

- Bring your own water bowl to dog parks and play areas. Avoid communal dishes and water bowls.
- Do not bring your dog to parks and play areas if they show *any* signs or symptoms of a respiratory infection.
- Leave the park/play area if you see any other dogs exhibiting symptoms.
- We encourage you to discuss any further precautions with your vet.
